FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: 20th Sunday of Ordinary Time The "Bread of Life" discourse, despite seeming complex, develops two major themes: people will attain eternal life by coming to Jesus and being in union with him; this coming and living in union flow from God's gracious initiative manifest in Jesus. The eucharistic reference echoes throughout the discourse, however the discourse also has deep roots in the biblical tradition. The Old Testament images of feeding are associated with God's gift of wisdom. It is important to recognize that the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist cannot be separated from the "wisdom" his life communicates. The discourse reaches a crescendo with the startling claim: "Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the third day" (6:54). Though we tend to identify "eternal life" as the promised reward following death, in John's gospel it begins in this life as a gift from Jesus. Eternal life is total "abiding" with God. People of faith participate in this life on this side of the grave. It is the life that is sustained by eating Jesus' flesh and blood. The utter realism of eating flesh and drinking blood was shocking to Jesus' hearers, as it would today if taken literally. The words must clearly refer to the Eucharist. They simply reproduce the words we hear in the Synoptic account of the institution of the Eucharist (Matt 26:26-28): "Take, eat; this is my body;...drink...this is my blood." John clearly understands these terms "sacramentally." Here the shocking language and startled reaction of the listeners serve as a challenge to believers to affirm the seemingly impossible. In receiving the Eucharist, our full humanity is joined with the full but transformed humanity of Jesus, and this constitutes life in its fullness, which will never be taken away.
