FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: The prophetic life is a strong theme in our readings this week. The term, prophet, comes from the Greek, "prophetes" - literally, one who speaks "on behalf of." A prophet speaks on behalf of God, is God's messenger. The prophet also speaks on behalf of those who have no one to speak for them, giving a voice to the voiceless (for example, the widow, the orphan, the poor, the stranger in the land). A prophet is not primarily a fore-teller, but a forthteller, who proclaims with insight the evils that afflict society and can ultimately spell its downfall. Prophets are "radical" in the sense that they reach back into the deepest roots of a religious tradition and summon people to be faithful to them. On that understanding, Jesus was a prophet. He proclaimed the nearness of God's reign, urged people to change their minds and take a second look at their lives. Furthermore, he embodied God's mercy by associating with the marginal and suspect people of his day. The gospel this Sunday also shows that the greatest enemy to faith can simply be "familiarity": a refusal to believe that God's presence could come to us in so familiar a form as the person next door. The Nazarenes had their own fixed ideas as to where and how the Messiah should come to Israel and the one they knew as the carpenter, Mary's son, simply did not fit the bill. Progress in the spiritual life almost always shows itself in the ability to recognise God more and more in the ordinary, the everyday. The great saints never ceased being filled with wonder at the mysterious presence of God they constantly sensed all around them. The full meaning of the Incarnation is not only that the Son of God became a human being, but that he took human form in a town as ordinary and insignificant and out of the way as Nazareth. The gospel invites us to identify and name the "Nazareth" in our own selves.
