FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: When Jesus returns home to Capernaum, again he draws a large crowd. His relatives decide to come from Nazareth to restrain him because they have heard rumours but he has gone crazy. Meanwhile, some scribes from Jerusalem charge that Jesus is possessed by a demon, and that he performs his exorcisms and healings out of demonic power. The opponents acknowledge that Jesus does perform exorcisms and healings. The problem concerns the source or origin of Jesus' power to do so. In responding to their charges and exposing the illogical nature of their position, Jesus uses parables. If Jesus were an instrument of Satan, then Satan's house and Satan's Kingdom will be divided and so could not stand for long. Also, by exorcising demons, Jesus is effectively overpowering Satan ("the strong man") and showing himself to be the stronger one. Finally, Jesus defines the unforgivable sin as the failure to discern that the Holy Spirit is at work in his ministry of exorcism and healing. To accuse him of doing so through the "prince of devils" is tantamount to identifying the Spirit of God with the unclean spirits of the demonic world. Then members of Jesus' family arrive at Capernaum and ask to see him. Instead of acceding to their request, Jesus redefines his family as those who dedicate themselves to doing the will of God. Such persons are Jesus' true brothers and sisters.

THE NEW LECTIONARY, which is the book that contains the Scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, to reflect current biblical scholarship and to provide a text for use in liturgical setting that is more proclaimable. The Lectionary will become mandatory for use from Advent 2024. The four volumes that we use on the ambo at Mass are £695 a set and the Book of the Gospels is £275.
