FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: In the ancient world, widowhood was a frightening prospect. The Hebrew and Greek terms for "widow" come from roots that suggest helplessness, emptiness or being forsaken. Jesus warns the crowd against the pretence of scribal practice, their social and religious posturing. They like: "to walk about in long robes, to be greeted obsequiously in the market squares, to take the front seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets." These are hard words, but they get harder. Scribal affluence is a product of swallowing the property of widows. The point is clear: scribal piety has been debunked as a thin veil for economic opportunism and exploitation. Jesus charges them with full responsibility for these abuses and announces that their sentence will be more severe. Next, we find Jesus sitting, facing the treasury and watching people donating money. He sees a poor widow throwing in a couple of coins. The contrast is stark, not only between the rich, who give out of their surplus, and the widow, but also between the widow and the scribes. This passage has been primarily interpreted as Jesus praising the widow for putting in all she had. This remains a valid interpretation. However recently scholars have suggested that Jesus' statement may be an indictment of the temple establishment, which took advantage of the little people. A widow is being impoverished by her obligations to the temple cultus. Jesus condemns the value system that motivates her action, and he condemns the people who conditioned her to do it. The temple has robbed this woman of her very means of livelihood. Like the scribal class, it no longer protects widows but exploits them. However, some scholars see this interpretation as being more appropriate to Luke's parallel (21:1-4).
