FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: The liturgical year concludes with a feast instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925. It affirmed the primacy of Christ in the face of rising nationalism and fascism. The gospel today (the gospel according to John) presents one of the most dramatic scenes in the New Testament. According to John, the legal proceedings against Jesus took place with Pontius Pilate presiding. Pilate served as the Roman governor, or prefect, of Judea from AD 26-36. His headquarters was at Caesarea Maritima, but during pilgrimage festivals such as Passover he would come to Jerusalem to keep the peace. The ancient reports about him portray him as cruel and ruthless. The scene occurs inside Pilate's headquarters and features a conversation between him and Jesus about Jesus' identity as King of the Jews. If Jesus claims to be a king, he could be executed as a rebel against the Roman Empire. When Jesus explains that his kingship is not an earthly, political kingship and that his real mission is to testify to the truth (that is, to reveal his heavenly Father), Pilate fails to grasp the nature of Jesus' kingship or the nature of truth. At the centre of John's account of Jesus' trial story is the irony that the one who is mocked as "King of the Jews" really is the King of the Jews to the eyes of faith. Pilate stands before Jesus and asks, "What is truth?" Speaking in London in 2019, Lord Hall, director-general of the BBC, warned that the world is facing "the biggest assault on truth since the 1930s." Comparing the spread of fake news to Nazi propaganda in the build-up to the Second World War, he said "An assault on truth is an assault on democracy." Jesus came to testify to the truth. How may we also be witnesses to the truth?
