FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: The readings today speak of a God who is partial to the voiceless and afflicted. Jesus' healing of a deaf and mute man takes place in Gentile territory, in the Decapolis – the constellation of largely Gentile cities east of the Sea of Galilee. The people there present as a candidate for healing a deaf man who speaks with difficulty. Whereas in most healing stories Jesus cures immediately by word alone, here he engages in a complex ritual that borders on magic. Jesus first places his fingers in the man's ears. Next he spits and touches his tongue. (In some circles saliva was thought to have healing power.) Then he utters the Aramaic word Ephphatha, which means "Be opened." The result is the man hears and even speaks plainly. While the gestures recall descriptions of magical cures in the Hellenistic world, there is no working of magic here. The healing comes about through the summoning of divine power (looking up to heaven and groaning) and then by an authoritative word of command. When Jesus orders the witnesses to be silent about the miracle, it has the opposite effect. The reason for the command to be silent seems to be that only with Jesus' death and resurrection does his true identity become clear. The crowd's joy ("he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak") evokes the hopes of Jews returning from exile in Babylon (6th Century B.C.) in our first reading from Isaiah 35. In this experience the man represents all believers. Apart from the grace of God we are "deaf" to the Word of life spoken to us by the Creator. By opening our ears, Jesus gives us the capacity to hear his life-giving Word, which he then speaks to us in the Scriptures proclaimed by the church.
